The ideal candidate must be committed to teaching, advising, mentoring students, and serving on university committees as designated by Academic Administration. Candidates should be members in good standing of the Seventh-day Adventist church and have a strong commitment to Christian higher education. Licensure in professional counseling or related areas is preferred.
